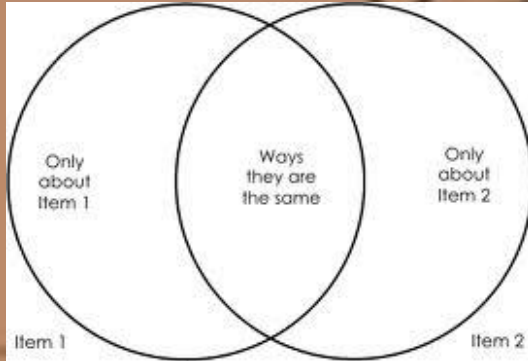


* **Extra Work for Champions:**
